New Civil Penalty Legislation

Senate Enrolled Act No. 227

Effective July 1, 2021

Creates transparent, structured, & consistent penalty assessment requirements for OISC Eliminates the previous rule (357 IAC 1-6) required for civil penalty law implementation

Eliminates differing penalties for private applicators vs. all other applicators/regulated entities

Eliminates escalating penalty schedule for 1st, 2nd, 3rd... violation within 5 years Incorporates concepts of higher penalties for adverse effects, RUP vs. GUP, intent, knowing or fraudulent acts

New Civil Penalty Legislation

Written WARNING for 1st incident of violation of any requirement in state law or regulation that is <u>not</u> specifically included in the \$500 or \$1000 penalty categories.

\$250 for 2nd and subsequent incidents of violation within the 5 years of the date of the warning for the same violation type.

\$500 Civil Penalty Category

Unknowingly offered for sale or distribution an unregistered pesticide

Unknowingly distributed a RUP without an RUP dealer registration

Stored a GUP minibulk container outside of secondary containment after 30-day delivery date

Offered for sale or distributed a:

- Misbranded pesticide
- Adulterated pesticide
- Pesticide in a non-compliant container

\$500 Civil Penalty Category



\$1000 Civil Penalty Category

Knowingly:

• Produced, offered to sell or distribute a non-registered pesticide

• Distributed an RUP without an RUP dealer registration

Distributed an RUP to a noncertified person.

Produced, distributed, offered for sale, stored, handled or transported a pesticide in a container not in compliance with FIFRA or in a manner to cause injury to man or the environment.

After notice, refused to comply with the law, rules, or a lawful order of the IPRB or OISC.

Violated a stop sale or action order from OISC.

Impede or prevent OISC in performing its duty.

Store any (GUP or RUP) bulk container or any RUP minibulk container (after 30-day delivery date) outside of secondary containment.

\$1000 Civil Penalty Category

Operated in a careless or negligent manner	Refused to keep records or supply investigation or inspection information to OISC	Intentionally made false reports or records	Knowingly operated without a license
Refused to comply with limits or restrictions licenses or permits	Used fraud in getting or maintaining a license or altered a license	Impersonated any government official	Aided or abetted a person to evade or conspired to evade the law
	Misused a RUP resulting in an adverse effect	Drifted a RUP resulting in an adverse effect	

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Old vs. New Drift Violation Comparison

Violation	Product	Adverse Effect	Old Penalty (PA)	Old Penalty (CA)	New Penalty (all)
Off-label	GUP	No	WRN	WRN	WRN; \$250 (5 years)
Off-label	GUP	Yes	\$100	\$250/ \$500/ \$1000	\$500

Drift rule	GUP	No	NA	NA	NA

Civil Penalty Mitigation

No mitigation for \$1000 penalty category

Mitigation potential for \$250 and \$500 categories

OISC may reduce penalty 20% for each:

- Cooperated with OISC during investigation or inspection
- Took corrective action to prevent repeat of similar violation
- Compensated a victim for any adverse effect resulting from violation

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Licensing Action Considerations for Drift Violations in Enforcement Response Policy

Old ERP

- 4 GUP drift violations within 5 years
- 3 RUP drift violations within 5 years
- 2 documented human exposure violations from drift within 5 years

Proposed ERP

- 3 drift violations with adverse effects within 2 years
- 2 documented human exposure violations from drift within 2 years
