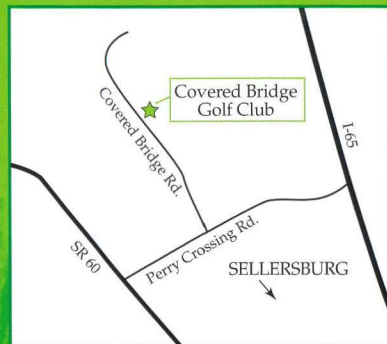

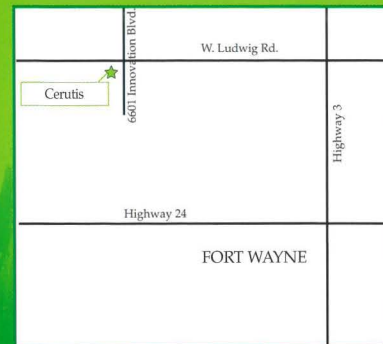

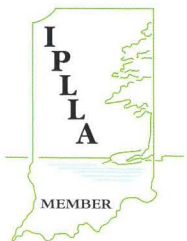

9:00 – 10:00 am	<p><b>“What Is New In Our Ever Changing Industry”</b></p> <p><i>Jim Canning – PBI Gordon 1 CCH requested in Category 3B and RT</i></p> <p>There are many new and emerging technologies either available to us or on their way. Formulation changes in broadleaf weed herbicides will allow treatments to be more effective. We’ll also talk about new sedge controls and the new active ingredient (Pyrimilsulfan). Finally, we need to discuss how disruptions in the supply chain will continue to impact the turf industry this year and into the future.</p>
10:00 – 11:00 am	<p><b>“Soil Amendments: The What, Why, and How of Plant Utilization”</b></p> <p><i>Mark Sybouts – Advanced Turf Solutions 1 CCH requested in Category 3A-3B-RT</i></p> <p>With the use of soil amendments increasing in interest and popularity, it is important for us all to actually understand why we should be interested in these tools in our lawn and landscape programs. Today, we will look at what they are. We’ll look at the actual multiple reasons for implementing such amendments and how they affect the quality of turf as well as ornamental plants and thus the need for pesticide use on them.</p>

In addition, we will review common questions and problems that occurred in 2021, the new civil penalty law, and proposed changes to record keeping, pesticide storage and Registered Technician (RT) requirements.</p>
1:00 – 2:00 pm	<p><b>“The Emerging Business of Commercial/Residential Mosquito Control”</b></p> <p><i>-Lee Green – Indiana Department of Health 1 CCH requested in Categories 7A-8-and RT</i></p> <p>For years, we have associated mosquito control with “community wide” applications performed by government agencies. This is changing as we see the emergence of a relatively new but fast growing business of commercial mosquito control made by private lawn care and pest control companies. This new opportunity will come with some new training and also may be a place for you to expand services to your customers. The Pesticide Review Board recognizes that there are challenges involved as we need to learn about mosquito biology and proper techniques to control each life stage of this pest. Today we will learn about site assessment, application timing, technique, and equipment options. Lee will also discuss customer communication, limiting product drift, and where to apply and where not to. Whether mosquito control is now on your service menu or not, this class will be a great chance to learn more about this emerging business.</p>

2:15 – 3:15 pm	<p><b>“Considering Application Methods &amp; Timing for Control of Disease and Other Pests in Your Lawn and Landscape”</b></p> <p><i>-Jake Green – NuFarm 1 CCH requested in Categories 3A-3B- and RT</i></p> <p>Insects and disease often have a negative impact on our landscape plantings and turf. This talk will focus on proper identification and control measures of disease and insect pests that affect trees, shrubs, and turf. Product selection, timing, and using proper application methods are crucial to getting good control of them.</p>
